June 2006

National Child Development Research Center (NCDRC) was established by the Cabinet as a <u>national reference center</u> for research and development on Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) in Malaysia NCDRC's core function is to develop a **national child database** to facilitate in <u>Reviewing and Drafting of national legislations on ECCE</u>, <u>Child's Growth</u>, <u>Research and Development</u> and <u>all</u> aspects of national ECCE programs.

Responsibilities

The Cabinet meeting of June 21 2006 has agreed on principle the establishment of NCDRC at Universiti Pendidikan Sultan dris (UPSI) as a natural reference center with the task of conducting research a areas of child progress and development. Apropositive task described for this establishment, the NCDRC has also received the mandate from UPSI Board of Directors and the Ministry of Higher Education. NCDRC is to assist the PERMATA National Policy Council in carrying out a Pioneer Program encapsulated with the idea of "Every Child's a National Gem" which began in March 2007 and which will last for two years.

One of NCDRC's main foci is to build a database of children's profile in Malaysia It will also build a directory of experts, professionals from diverse background but concerned with different aspects of child-development and well-being. Apart from that, the Center will also build a research database specific to child care and child-development from all institutions and agencies in the country.

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Introduction

April 2012

NCDRC submitted a proposal to EPU to seek allocation to established the NCDC. Numerous presentations to all relevant ministries took place gained full support.

Nov 2012

EPU approved RM1.7 million to UPSI to embark on NCDC Feasibility Study with the objectives mentioned in the Term of Reference (TOR).

March 2013

The study began, and scheduled to end in September 2013.
